PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



Principal's Report

Welcome back to Term 2. We will have a focus this Term on assessment and reporting with Year 12 having complete their Midcourse Examinations and Year 11 now half way through their Preliminary Course work. Our half yearly assessment activities and testing will also be in full swing so students need to ensure they are working to complete activities and prepare for all upcoming tasks.

We return this Term with some staffing changes. We welcome Mrs Debritt to the position of Deputy Principal of Jamison High School. She takes over from Mr

Grahame who has been seconded by the Department to work in Parramatta. We have also appointed a third Deputy Principal to implement and drive our Strategic Improvement Plan. This role specifically targets student performance in the top 2 bands for the HSC as well as performance on external examinations including NAPLAN. Mrs Freemantle has been appointed to this position. Mrs Schofield takes on the role as Relieving Head Teacher Science and Ms Margetts has been appointed to the role of Year 8 Year Adviser and will assist Mrs Simpson in this role. At the end of Term we farewelled Mrs Bourke from support and we expect to announce a permanent appointment to our Support Faculty shortly.

The 2020 Annual Report is now available for download on our School website. If you want to know about the programs and activities that ran last year and about our School performance, please review the document. Due to the disrupted learning from last year, it is an account of schooling in a pandemic and makes for interesting reading. We will present our Annual Report at the next P&C Meeting on Tuesday night.

We have also been preparing for moving NAPLAN testing online. Next week these examinations will run for Years 7 and 9 students. Separate communication has been put out to parents about this. We have been preparing for this for quite a while in terms of focused activities in classes and targeted support and tutoring for students. As we move to the online testing, we have trained a group of staff to ensure the smooth running of the tests and to support students as the complete the NAPLAN components. A reminder that students will require a set of wired headphones that can be plugged into our computers in order to complete the NAPLAN Tests.

There have been a number of student led fundraising activities this year. Last term we raised funds for The World's Greatest Shave as well as for a women's shelter. This Term the school turned pink for a day on Wednesday April 28. This was to raise funds for the McGrath Foundation. We are aware that this fundraiser is very close to home for a number of our families and this was shown in the generosity of our community which saw us raise over \$1000 for this cause. A special thank you to Year 12 Work Studies students Chaise Bell, Ben Lees, Jackson McGrath and Hayden Schempp who organised the event.

Our sporting success is now back on the agenda as competitions start up again. We have been competing in various knock out competitions and our carnivals are now in full swing. We had students compete recently at the Combined High Schools State Swimming. Congratulations to 12 Boys 100 Freestyle competitor Zack Leydecker and the 16 Girls Relay team, Charlotte Gimson, Sky Stevens, Emily Paine-Bell and Chelsea Sutton. We look forward to more participation in knockout and other sporting events to extend our curriculum.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT CONT.

We have also implemented our Senior Study for Year 11 and 12 students. This is to support students through their final two years of schooling and it is a designated area of the Library for students to work in and be supported by staff through their studies. We have the provision of English and mathematics tutoring as well as study resources, course outlines and access to printing facilities for students.

We have been dealing with issues around student use of various Social Media platforms. While it can be a wonderful tool for students to stay connected and to gain information, there are also many pitfalls and dangers associated with online activity. Earlier this year as part of our Anti-Bullying Plan we had our Police Liaison Officer come to the school and run workshops for students in Years 7 to 10. He focused on the law, safety online as well as implications of cyber bullying. We also ran a workshop for parents in Years 8 and 9 around the dangers of Social Media. Parents are encouraged to discuss and monitor their child's use of Social Media to ensure they are safe and make good decisions during their time online.

We also have concerns around access to and the use of Vapes. At the start of the Term we sent our correspondence on the risks and dangers associated with Vaping. You can help in this area by talking to your child about the dangers of smoking/vaping. Parents are also encouraged to report those who are selling cigarettes and e-cigarettes to minors.

We are progressing with the plans for the construction of the new school Multi-Purpose Facility. We expect work will commence soon. This will cause some disruption at the front of the School and will mean that a large section is fenced off while construction takes place. We will keep our community informed of updates on the construction and about access to the school. The timeline sees the completion of the facility for early next year.

We are currently updating our email addresses for parents to ensure our School Bytes system has correct contact information. If you have recently changed your email address, please contact the school so that we can update your details. We are also contacting some parents to gain email addresses for contact through School Bytes. When we first introduced this program we focused mainly on it being for excursions and payments. Increasingly we are using it for communication about School Programs and Events along with our Social Media Pages. A reminder to parents that we also run closed Facebook Groups for parents only. These are aligned to individual Year Groups.

The last P&C meeting was the Annual General Meeting. At that meeting a new committee was elected. I would like to acknowledge and thank the outgoing President Natasha Webster for her timeless service to the school during her tenure and the way she worked with staff to support students. Her leadership and in particular fundraising activities have funded many of the improvements around the school. I would also like to acknowledge Jo Miller Crisp, the former treasurer for her management and organisation while on the committee, I welcome the incoming committee President Warren Apap, Vice President Kate Harrison, Secretary Jodie Paulin and Treasurer Kate Lancaster. Our next meeting is Tuesday May 11 at 7 pm in Aspires Café.

Finally, It was a pleasure to attend the City Of Penrith RSL Sub Branch School ANZAC Day Service at Penrith Paceway. The School had a delegation of students who attended and we were represented in all areas of the service. A special mention to our School Captains Grace Lees and Nicklas Lusch who were selected to host the service, a role they undertook with distinction and respect.

Deputy's Desk

Term Two is historically a thriving and bustling time in the school calendar as our school community approaches the last weeks of Semester 2. It is the first of the two formal assessment and reporting cycles for the year combined with NAPLAN for Year 7 & Year 9. Staff and students busily engaged in a variety of assessment tasks, examinations, marking, reporting and Parent/Teacher evenings. Term Two also offers many other extracurricular activities such as JobQuest, Zone Cross Country and Athletic Carnivals, and the Western Sydney Careers Market, to name a few. Jamison High School has a superb reputation within our local community. This reputation is vital for our students who wish to transition to university, work, TAFE, apprenticeships and so many other opportunities.

Year 12

Year 12 have approximately 15 weeks of formal schooling before they begin their HSC Examinations. Students will sit their Trial HSC examinations commencing Term 3, Week 2. The Trial HSC is crucial for students as it mirrors the expectations of the HSC Examination. Most examinations are 3 hours in length and therefore require students to have the necessary knowledge and skills to use the allocated time wisely so as to achieve their best. Students should now be in a regular study pattern, practising past papers and accessing staff for feedback and advice. Year 12 will receive their Trial HSC Examination timetable before the end of the school term giving them the opportunity to use their term break to study.

Year 11

Year 11 have recently completed a range of assessment items. It will be important for students to reflect on their results and develop strategies that will assist them in future tasks. Teachers are busy working on developing higher order thinking skills with their students and the development of literacy skills via the use of ALARM (A Learning and Response Matrix). Teachers are focusing on providing feedback to students about their writing style and suggesting areas for improvement through the submission of draft work samples. Students are also being encouraged to reflect on their own learning style and to set clear, aspirational learning goals for themselves. Students have access to their teacher mentors to assist them in this process.

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT CONT.

Year 10

Year 10 students are about to begin their HSC Subject Selection Process where they select subjects and patterns of study for their senior school years. At Jamison High School we provide a very comprehensive Mentor program. The program involves meetings and guidance from

teacher mentors and parent and student interviews to ensure that students are able to make informed choices based on their interests, abilities and future directions. Year 10 and their

parents will have access to a Subject Selection Evening where staff are on hand giving students and parents the opportunity to discuss course requirements and senior commitments.

Uniform

We set and support a high standard for our school uniform. Wearing the correct uniform demonstrates to our local community, which employs our young people, that Jamison High School imparts pride, ethics and values across our student community. Winter is upon us and parents and students are reminded that school jumpers, sloppy joes and jackets are available from the Uniform Shop. When your child leaves for school please insist that they wear Jamison High School uniform items.

Due to Work Health and Safety requirements, footwear must comply with the NSW Department of Education Guidelines. Student's shoes must be all black, the entire foot is to be covered by the shoe, and the shoe must have a stout sole and firm leather uppers.

Reminder - tracksuit pants, hoodies and non-school coloured items of any kind are NOT part of the Jamison High School uniform and are unacceptable attire for any reason. Our policy is to supply loan socks, jumpers, pants and skirts for students to change into for the day if they are not in correct uniform.

Given that our ultimate goal is to assist parents raise responsible, morally ethical and socially responsible young people we are proud to acknowledge the majority of parents who support our commitment and expertise in delivering successful learning and wellbeing outcomes for our students which starts with Safe Respectful Aspirational Learners who embrace the Jamison Way. Parents may enquire about a payment plan to purchase items immediately. Please contact the appropriate Deputy Principal or Year Adviser for assistance. There is a limited amount of school jumpers/uniform items in the clothing pool, in excellent condition which can also assist families as needed. The school uniform shop opening hours are:

Tuesday afternoon 12.30pm – 4.30pm

Friday morning 7.30am – 11.30am.

Merit System

Another aspect of our PBL Program is our school merit system. It is very pleasing that so many of our students strive to be recognised and rewarded for their cooperation and diligence in their studies. Students place the Teacher's Awards in their House Box once they have obtained a Faculty Award and House Points are awarded on the basis of the number submitted from each house. Faculty Awards lead to Year Adviser Awards and ultimately Deputy Principal Awards and Principal Medallions.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What time does school start?

School **starts at 8:25**. Students are to make their way to home room at the sound of this bell. All students should be seated in home room by the 8:30 bell. A student who arrives after the 8:30 bell, must report to the office to sign in.

"So, my child is sometimes late for school - does it matter that much?"

School is usually the first place where children are made aware of the importance of regular timekeeping.

Arriving early will boost your child's confidence for the day, and set them in the right frame of mind for learning and achievement. If a child arrives late the whole class is disrupted and the teacher has to repeat the same things over and over again-losing valuable teaching time. Punctuality and good attendance will always be important—at school now and later at work.

Help to make sure your child is given a good start in life by ensuring they arrive at school on time.

What Do I Do If My Child is Late to School?

You may do any of the following:

- 1. Accompany your child to the front office and provide a verbal explanation
- 2. Phone the school to provide a verbal explanation
- 3. Send a written explanation with your child when they arrive to school on the day they are late

What to do if my child is persistently late?

If your child is persistently late, they will be interviewed by their mentor or year advisor and an improvement program will be implemented. Consequences may be imposed if there is no improvement made.

What can I do to help my child?

Overslept	\rightarrow	Have a back-up plan in case the alarm fails to go off
Late Night	\rightarrow	Go to bed early - save the late nights for the weekend
Can't find my shirt, book etc	\rightarrow	Be organised and have everything ready to go the night before
Dawdling on the way to school	\rightarrow	Walk faster!
Stopping off at the shops	\rightarrow	Leave the shops by 8:15
Missed the bus	\rightarrow	Parent to ring the school, written explanation to follow
Appointment e.g dentist, driving test	\rightarrow	Do your best to avoid scheduling appointments during school
